CRIME LOG

On June 21, 2002 our neighbor Veronica Mohr suffered over \$2500 in property loss when her car was broken into on Kingman Avenue. Among the missing items were CD wallets and approximately 150 CDs, a stereo faceplate and cell phone charger.

CODE ENFORCEMENT UPDATE

Loren Due conducted another curbside sweep in the SNI section of SONA. Code Enforcement officers drove through the neighborhood looking for any code violations visible from the street.

Code Enforcement found only 4 violations in our neighborhood compared to over 60 in the sweep conducted five months ago. **We should give ourselves a big round of applause**. This is a great example of how we utilized existing programs at no cost to benefit the neighborhood.

UNITED NEIGHBORHOODS

The City of San Jose's Strong Neighborhood Initiative (SNI) has generated governing Policy Advisory Committee (PAC) and Neighborhood Action Committee (NAC) to develop ongoing projects in the SNI boundaries. The PAC is an oversight committee of elected and appointed citizens. NAC is the local organizing committee comprised of several neighborhood organizations along with school and other community resource groups.

PAC meetings are held once a month on the 4th Wednesday of the month. Meetings are rotated to a different district each month but always begin at 6:00 p.m. with dinner and socializing.
