At the August 17, 2004 meeting, SONA's board of directors unanimously voted to approve the appointment of Tommie Ellis to the vacant board position. Planning Workshop a Success

Several SONA residents attended the August 7, 2004 Planning Workshop at Sherman Oaks Community Center. This event, sponsored by the Burbank/Del Monte Neighborhood Advisory Committee brought Planning Director Stephen Haase and staffer Dionne Early in to explain and discuss several hot topics with the planning department.

Attendees learned how projects go step by step through the Planning Department and what the criteria for different zoning regulations are.

After that was an overview and discussion of secondary units (sometimes called granny or in-law units) and the City San Jose's efforts to regulate and administrate the building and use of such units. City's around the state are being told by the State of California that they need to develop a plan as part of required in-fill and low income housing. There area currently no legal grounds for building secondary units in San Jose. The proposed ordinance would affect 9% of the city's current R1 or residentially zoned lots.

The Housing Opportunities Study (HOS) has identified possible areas that could be re-zoned into high density transit oriented housing. All of these properties are within Council District 6 and in the general area between Meridian and downtown. These units have the potential for drastically increasing the number of residents close by.



October Is Your Next Chance At Dumpster Day


The final 2004 SONA dumpster/clean up day will be on Saturday, October 23,

SONA Talks with SJCC

After a series of incidents following the July 21, 2004 All-Star game, SONA residents met with SJCC president Tsang and members of his staff. SONA requested increased police and security in the neighborhoods both during and after the games this fall. After outlining the problems of vandalism and congestion following the All-Star game, President Tsang stated he would be working with his staff and would draft a response to SONA at the end of August. SONA members reminded the staff that these were ongoing problems and not related to just one game or event. Among the problems associated with the site are traffic congestion, unsafe pedestrian access, increase in crime, noise and vandalism. The July 21 event saw neighbors subjected to roaming groups of youth who were determined to create an uproar in the neighborhood. SONA did not request a halt to events, but requested again that additional security be put in the neighborhoods to make them as safe and trouble free as the campus is during events.




