Notes and News

Congratulations and thanks to everyone who participated in our February 28, 2009 event!

Over 80 people planted trees, swept sidewalks, cleaned graffiti, picked up litter and cleaned gutters along Moorpark Avenue. And all this was done while dumpster day was running. We hope everyone had a chance to get rid of all the "stuff" that accumulates around the home.

Heart Safe City was the theme of our February meeting. We learned that people treated within the first four minutes of a cardiac event will have a much greater chance of survival. In San Jose we can expect emergency response teams to arrive at our homes in eight minutes 80% of the time, leaving at least four extra minutes of danger. In the past you would have to go through a day long CPR training session to ensure you can react in such a situation. SJFD is now offering a "CPR Anytime" course that can be taken in less than an hour and will be presented at our April meeting. You will be trained in how to assist a cardiac arrest victim and be given a DVD to take home. You are then encouraged to train your family members, friends and neighbors. Seating at our April meeting will be limited so we will provide sign up info in our next newsletter. This class is appropriate for all ages and is being taught in middle and high schools. Since 25% of all cardiac victims are under the age of 25, it is important that we train people of all ages. This is also a great course for those of us who took CPR many years ago and could use a refresher. While not a certified life saving course, it can still help you keep someone alive for those 4 minutes.

Our City Forest will be our guests at our March meeting. Besides their incredible program of providing free trees for public streets, they have a program that supplies appropriate shade trees for your yard. You can learn what type of species is appropriate, sign up for the program and learn more about tree maintenance in general. Appropriate shade trees add to the value of property, store rain water and reduce your summer energy costs.

SONA election for board members will be held at our April meeting. Anyone can be a board member if they are willing to give a couple hours a month towards developing speaker programs, working closer with neighbors here and outside SONA and coordinating projects. Contact any board member with questions.

The Squeaky Wheel Corps will email a Community Response Alert to others in the Corps with the details along with the name and telephone number of the governmental agency to be called for action.

Each member of Corps will be asked to politely call that agency within 24 hours requesting correction.

Follow up will be undertaken to see that the problem is corrected and whether additional Community Response Alerts may be needed.

As the old adage goes, "the squeaky wheel gets the grease". As President Obama's election has proven, an organized community can bring about change. Our strength will be in our numbers - many people calling to get government into action and to seek mutual assistance. Not just one person. So please join **The Squeaky Wheel Corps** today!

REMINDER: This system is **not** for Emergency situations. **Call 911 if you have an emergency or your problem is so sever that it needs immediate attention.**



