If you have questions about what's going on in San Jose and want records of a meeting, the City Manager has set up a new website link that allows you to request items online instead of going down to City Hall.

And, remember, if you go to City Hall during the day or for an evening meeting, parking is free in the underground garage. There are validation machines at all offices and in the rotunda. Don't park in the retail area across the street and don't feed the meter should never be flushed down the toilet or thrown on the street or at the 4th Street Garage.

With San Jose officially over the 1,000,000 mark, it's more important than ever to make sure our census data is accurate. Help spread the word that when the data collectors come calling it doesn't matter who you are, it just matters that you give accurate information. We depend on the funds allocated to us from the State and Federal governments to keep services rolling.

The City of San Jose's Environmental Services department has free exchanges at community centers around the city. The next one is at the Southside Community Center on Cottle Road on May 20. #### San Jose City College Update

SONA residents met several times outside of our general meetings during the last few months to develop a strategic response to the Subsequent Draft Environmental Impact Report (SDEIR) that included the plans for future development on campus. This plan is a guideline for improvements through the year 2041 and includes a new parking garage, the partially constructed Baseball Field Complex and other items.

SONA's 16 page report can be found on our website and a copy will be available at meetings. We will continue to post the most recent information on our website, including responses from other agencies or groups. We urge you to check in on our website because time lines for meetings regarding this issue can change.

We have been advised that certification of the SDEIR that was scheduled for the May 12 Board of Trustees Meeting has been postponed. At this time we have no information regarding when this issue will be discussed in open forum by the Trustees.

In the meantime, SONA residents will continue to investigate all of our options and will continue to hold strategy meetings. While we hope that the delay in certification means the District is taking a hard look at questions raised, we should continue to look at all possible scenarios and be prepared to answer any actions taken by the Board of Trustees.

Residents are also gathering signatures on petitions to object to the current plans for the Baseball Field Complex. You can obtain a blank petition on our website or by contacting Steve Kline.

In the meantime, there is good news for the residents along the southern border of the campus! After years of back and forth, promises and plans, the sound and privacy wall is now under construction. This will mean that residents will have a buffer between residential units and the campus which will make it easier to bear construction activity as well as long term use along that side of the campus. Residents are very excited to see this phase begin.
