## Notes from the President

The call for seasonal flu shots has been high this year, with some local offices running out, but they are restocking just for you. Flu shots are also available at most pharmacies now for those who want them. The H1N1 inoculation should be available shortly. In the meantime, take precautions. Hand washing is always the # 1 way to beat back germs and viruses, but carrying around alcohol wipes or gel is a great way to protect yourself. And, always take advantage of wiping down a shopping cart. You really don't want to know how gross they are if not treated. Anytime you handle money, use a hand rail, open a public door, etc. you are touching somebody else's microbes. Not to be a fear monger, but we all know an ounce of prevention can save a week of feeling crummy.

Well, the first rains certainly were a test of our skills...did that roof patch hold up, did the gutters work properly? This was also a chance to see what storm drains are working correctly. If they backed up near your house, make sure you report it before the next round of rain. You can call the Department of Transportation at 277-4373 to report problems. You can also call the City's 24-hour hotline at 535-3500 to report problems. Meantime, make sure you stock up on supplies for power outages because sooner or later you will need them.

This is also a good time to check out your emergency kit that I know you've all prepared. Remember that kit? The one that will allow you to handle being on your own for a week or more in a natural disaster? With the 20th anniversary of Loma Prieta behind us, it's easy to become complacent, but could your household stand on it's own for any length of time? Do you have current contact information for your neighbors? If your out of state family needed to reach you, do they know who your neighbors are? This only takes a few minutes.

If just 10 people per month paid dues, our newsletter costs would be covered. And, if you handed me a check recently and haven't seen it come out of your account, please check with Michael. 


