Notes and News

Any parent knows that "just this once" leads to "but, you let me do it before". The same holds true for "I'll let it slide today" when you see or hear something that needs to be fixed. Why let things go "just one day" when it's easy to call somebody and have it taken care of? On page 3 you'll see a list of handy phone numbers for just about any need. Note that you need to program your cell phone for San Jose's 911 and 311 numbers. Don't assume that somebody else has spotted and reported a problem.

The Board of Trustees for the San Jose Evergreen Community College District voted to approve the Draft Subsequent Environmental Impact Report on Tuesday, July 13. This paves the way for them to complete the Multi-Use field on Leigh Avenue while grandfathering in previous actions like the construction of surface parking lots that were installed a few years back. The Multi Use field is sized for soccer and will keep the bleachers, dugouts and restrooms. This could be a boon to locals who have no soccer fields, but it has also proven to be a spot for kids partying after dark. SONA lobbied for the DSEIR to include the impact of moving a majority of the parking and traffic to the Leigh Ave. side of campus because it has adversely affected our neighborhood. The trustees have approved a new educational master plan. This will lead to another round of EIR reviews while they determine what needs to be built, rehabilitated, repaired or improved to implement the educational master plan. This will allow SONA residents to voice opinions and concerns over future projects. In the meantime, the district is polling residents eligible to vote for future bonds to test the waters. New improvements, indeed any new capital expenditure (like buying new computers) will require money the district does not have. SONA residents recently advised the district we would be uncomfortable with supporting new bonds until new processes and safeguards are in place.

With summer in full swing, we know you are going through the water and soft drinks. **Don't** forget to save those recyclable bottles and cans for SONA to turn in. Jussi and Lisa will be making another round of pick ups, but if your bags, containers or garage get too full, you can always call them or bring your recyclables to the next SONA meeting. All funds raised through this recycling effort go directly towards printing the very newsletter you are reading.

Congrats to Board Member Steve Kline who was elected president of the Burbank/Del Monte Neighborhood Advisory Committee. The B/DM NAC is a coalition of neighborhoods formed as part of the Strong Neighborhoods Initiative that work on common goals and projects stretching from here to the old Del Monte Cannery area and Diridon Station.

SONA is now accepting online dues and donations via PayPal. If you want to save that cost of a stamp, simply go to our website and look for the PayPal button. This is a safe and secure way to send SONA money. SONA operates on a volunteer basis with dues and donations making up our entire budget. This allows us to hold meetings, insure our meeting sites, print newsletters and maintain our website. We run very lean thanks to all of our volunteers, but we do need to collect funds to keep afloat.

We didn't get the Bascom Community Center and Library on the contingency funding list, but we haven't given up. Each October or so, the City Council reviews budgets (after waiting for the State to get their budgets out) and makes adjustments. The Friends of Bascom Library will be working on getting our local library open. For more info, you can contact Steve.
