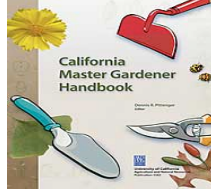
The City of San Jose recently wrapped up the redistricting that is required after the census comes out every ten years. Residents from around the city spoke out at a series of meetings about how they did (or did not) want things to change. Each council district must attempt to be as close to the average population (gross population of San Jose divided by 10). Our district saw a few changes at the southern and western borders, gaining a new neighborhood. Several SONA members monitored these meetings and we can say democracy can often be loud and messy, but it was an interesting process to watch.

While we haven't experienced a heat wave yet, the odds are that before the next newsletter comes out, we will. If your home does not have air conditioning, don't forget that the City of San Jose has "cooling stations" scattered around town at local community centers. This free service allows you to grab the kids or seniors and take a much needed break when it's too hot. Master Gardeners of Santa Clara County

Our May 2011 meeting was all about gardening, plants and pests. Thanks to a wonderful presentation by Laura Westley and a Q&A period after, SONA residents were given great facts of what the Master Gardener program is all about.

Since 1914 the University of California Cooperative Extension has provided residents with education and training in all areas of horticulture. The UCCE program helps keep local experts close at hand for residents around the state. In 1982 the first program in Santa Clara County began. Master Gardeners receive extensive training and then complete volunteer hours before becoming certified. All are volunteers though many work in the field of landscaping and/or gardening. You don't have to be a homeowner or have an extensive piece of property to be interested in growing plants and food at home. The Master Gardener program covers everything from landscape renovation to what grows best in a pot on the patio.

The Master Gardener program provides a variety of programs and services through their hotline, website and at the many demonstration gardens around the county. The San Jose hotline (408.282.3105) operates from 9:30am-12:30pm Monday through Friday to answer your gardening questions. You can also bring in items for identification at the main offices located at 1553 Berger Drive Monday through Wednesday. The website allows you to stay up on the latest events and news, request a speaker for your group and provides you with lots of hints, information and links to other sites. Visit www.mastergardeners.org/scc.

The Master Gardener program operates demonstration gardens throughout the county. If you are thinking of re-doing landscape, want to see how a water wise yard might look, are interested in growing something new, you can see these ideas in action in different climates throughout the county. The program also offers classes and workshops that allow you to figure out how to put your ideas into action.

For those who grow food at home, the program has a wealth of resources. You can use online tools to find out what grows best where and when to plant it as well as monthly gardening tips and "to do" lists. The Master Gardeners operate test gardens in various locations that allow them to determine whether or not a new tomato, pepper or chile grows consistently well here and then conducts plant sales at two major events each year. The spring sale is held at Kelly Park while the fall sale is held at Prusch Farm. If you are shopping for plants, get there early and bring something to carry your purchases in. These events have a wide variety of vendors offering anything you could possibly want for your yard, patio or acreage. The workshops and seminars run all day long, there are plenty of activities for kids and each location is a great place to spend the day.

The Master Gardener program can connect you with an amazing list of resources. You can download a copy of the California Master Gardener Handbook or pick one up at headquarters. While you're there you might also want to pick up one of the citrus or chili cookbooks on hand. You can connect to local certified landscapers, find a specific plant society or simply get caught up on the latest information concerning pests. Your group, organization, church or business can call on the speaker's bureau and they will tailor the visit to your needs.

Many classes and talks are held throughout the year at local libraries as well as at the demonstration gardens. Check the website, sign up for their online tips (emailed to you monthly) or join their Facebook page at UCCE Master Gardeners of Santa Clara County.

This organization runs on volunteers and does not charge for events, classes or workshops. It doesn't matter whether you are an old hand at gardening, a professional landscaper or just want to grow a single plant on your patio; this is the group that can help you achieve your goals.
